

Nebraska's Clean Indoor Air Act prohibits smoking inside child care facilities and in-home child care centers. The Caring for our Children National Health and Safety Performance Standards Guidelines recommend implementing a comprehensive tobacco-free/nicotine-free policy stronger than state law to coincide with the gold standard. Checklist for a Tobacco/Nicotine Free Policy

Prohibits all tobacco products

- Cigarettes
- Cigars
- Chewing tobacco
- Electronic smoking devices (Vaping)
- Other nicotine products
